About House of Heroes Connecticut

- The mission of House of Heroes Connecticut (HOHCT) is to recognize, honor and serve Connecticut military and public safety veterans and/or their spouses who have served our country faithfully and sacrificially. We do this by providing one day, no-cost home repairs through partnerships with and the generosity of individuals, civic organizations and corporations. We are committed to growing the organization and advancing the mission to the ever-increasing numbers of veterans both in Connecticut and nationwide.
- The Connecticut Chapter was founded in 2012 by Bill May, a former Black Hawk helicopter test pilot with more than 24 years of service, and Steve Cavanaugh, president and founder of Biltmore Construction in Hamden, Connecticut. Bill May passed away in December, 2016, at age 58 following a two-year battle with cancer.
- The Connecticut Chapter has provided no-cost home repairs to 69 Connecticut military and public safety veterans and/or their surviving spouses since 2012. Projects have been completed in 34 cities and towns throughout Connecticut, including two projects in Manchester (Raymond Daigle and Wayne McCoy). Including out-of-state projects, HOHCT has completed 78 projects through February, 2017.
- The Connecticut Chapter is part of House of Heroes national, a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization
 with offices in Columbus, Georgia. Additional chapters are located in Arizona, Georgia (3) and Iowa.
 Efforts are also underway in Delaware and South Carolina. Since its founding in 2000, House of
 Heroes has provided renovations to the homes of more than 900 military and public service
 veterans and/or their surviving spouses in 17 states.
- To qualify for assistance in the program, one must 1) be an honorably discharged military or public safety service veteran, or surviving spouse; 2) need financial and/or physical assistance with home repair, and; 3) own and occupy the home to be repaired.
- Home repairs include, but are not limited to, cleaning, painting, installation of access ramps, installations of screen windows and doors, repair or replacement of basic appliances, and yard maintenance and improvement. A priority is placed on enhancing safety and improving access.
 Home improvements are supervised by a local contractor and meet applicable codes.
- In 2015 under the leadership of the Connecticut Chapter, House of Heroes partnered with STANLEY
 Tools to help further spread the HOH message and mission nationwide. The STANLEY Tools and
 House of Heroes Build Your America partnership recognizes, honors and serves America's veterans,
 providing no-cost home repairs to America's heroes. Two homes in Illinois and North Carolina were
 renovated in 2016, with three homes (Texas, Louisiana, Ohio) scheduled for completion in 2017.
- House of Heroes, under the Connecticut Chapter's leadership, also partnered with the Army Aviation Association of America in April, 2016 for Operation HOHAAAA. The 73 AAAA chapters worldwide are being challenged to complete at least one House of Heroes project, providing meaningful support for aviation vets in need and increasing member engagement.
